## **Construction of FireKeepers Casino is On Schedule**

### **Project reaches another Significant Milestone**

Battle Creek, MI —Construction of FireKeepers Casino near Battle Creek is on schedule to open in Summer 2009 with the structural enclosure completed. FireKeepers Casino, under construction at Exit 104 off Interstate 94, is owned by the Nottawaseppi Huron Band of the Potawatomi and managed by Gaming Entertainment Michigan, L.L.C, a joint venture between Full House Resorts, Inc., (AMEX: FLL), which develops, manages and invests in gaming related opportunities and RAM Entertainment L.L.C., a privately owned investment company.

After nearly seven months of construction on the \$300 million casino, led by Clark Construction, the enclosure was completed Oct 29, 2008.

“The Tribe is pleased with the progress made by Clark Construction and our construction team as we continue to move forward toward the opening of FireKeepers Casino,” said Nottawaseppi Huron Band of the Potawatomi Tribal Chairperson Laura W. Spurr. “We’re excited by this latest milestone marking the completion of the casino enclosure. And as we had hoped, FireKeepers Casino is providing critical jobs and economic stimulus for the Calhoun County region.”

The 236,000 square foot casino is expected to provide approximately 2,200 jobs —700 construction jobs and 1,500 permanent positions, in addition to numerous spin-off jobs. So far, 215 crew members have been working on site for the project that is expected to have a \$8 million payroll.

"Our crew, which includes local skilled labor and tribal members, have been committed to performing excellent work on the project, resulting in the enclosure as scheduled," said Duane Wixson, Senior Project Manager for Clark Construction. "Now that the structure for FireKeepers Casino is enclosed, construction efforts will move to interior work during the upcoming winter months."

“FireKeepers Casino will be an exciting entertainment venue when it opens next summer,” said FireKeepers Casino General Manager R. Bruce McKee. “We are confident that our gaming patrons will enjoy a first-class gaming experience at FireKeepers.”

When opened, FireKeepers Casino will feature Las Vegas-style gaming: 2,500 slot machines, 90 table game and 20 poker games. FireKeepers will provide five restaurants: a 70-seat fine dining signature restaurant, a 300-seat buffet, and a 150-seat 24-hour coffee shop. The casino will have an attached and enclosed 2,078-space parking garage.
