Nottawaseppi Huron Band of the Potawatomi Hosts Annual Pow-Wow

(Fulton, Mich.) The Nottawaseppi Huron Band of the Potawatomi, located in Fulton, Mich., will host an annual pow-wow on June 22 and 23, 2013 at the Pine Creek Reservation.

The pow-wow will include traditional Native American food, culture, dancing, singing, handmade Native American arts and crafts, parade, 50/50 raffle, along with a car show. The pow-wow is free to attend and open to the public.

“We are very proud to offer this pow-wow to our community,” commented Christine Lanning, cultural committee chair and tribal council member for the Nottawaseppi Huron Band of the Potawatomi. “This is a great opportunity to gather and celebrate our heritage.”

The June 22 and 23 pow-wow will also feature a 5K run and 1K walk on Saturday, June 22, 2013. The 5K is set to begin at 9:00 a.m. and the 1K is set to begin at 10:00 a.m. Runners and walkers can register for the run and walk on the day of, beginning at 7:30 a.m., with a cost of \$20 for the 5K run and \$5 for the 1K walk, with all proceeds to benefit the Four Directions, One Purpose Charity. Registration includes a t-shirt and awards for each age division.
